Dear Dr. Sherrill:

The North Carolina Medical Board ("Board") has concluded its investigation regarding the action taken against your Alaska medical license by the Alaska State Medical Board ("Alaska Board"). Although the Board decided not to commence formal proceedings against your license, it did vote to issue you this public letter of concern.

The Board has learned that, on March 6, 2014, you entered into a Consent Agreement with the Alaska Board for failing to comply with continuing medical education ("CME") requirements as part of your online 2013-2014 biennial license renewal. You later admitted that you mistakenly affirmed that you had complied with the CME requirement of 50 hours for the licensing period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012. Following your renewal, your license was subject to a random audit during which it was discovered that you had only completed 44.5 hours of approved CME during the renewal time frame.

As a result, the Alaska Consent Agreement imposed the following terms:

1. You were fined \$3,500 with \$1,000 stayed;
2. You must complete at least 5.5 credit hours of a CME to satisfy the requirements to renew your license for 2013-2014 licensing period;
3. Your Alaska medical license was reprimanded;
4. Your license will be subject to mandatory audits for two future renewal periods to ensure compliance with the CME requirements.

The Board urges you to make sure the conduct giving rise to the Board's concerns does not happen again. Otherwise, the Board may vote to commence formal disciplinary proceedings against your North Carolina medical license. If that happens, this letter may be entered into evidence in determining the appropriate discipline.

The Board does not consider a public letter of concern to be a disciplinary action or a limitation or restriction on your license. However, the Board does consider its inquiry into this matter to be an investigation. Under certain circumstances, other credentialing, regulatory or licensing boards may require that you report this investigation. If so, a photocopy of this letter may be used for that purpose.



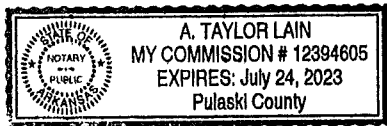
